

A Word from Grand Knight Art Krygowski

This month we recognize a holy day of obligation, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This holy day commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay—a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Nestled in the rear of a nearly 200-year-old cemetery along one of Detroit's signature thoroughfares, in one of the city's distressed neighborhoods, is a shrine dating back to 1881 that draws an estimated 10,000 to 15,000 pilgrims annually — the grotto at Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Grotto) Parish on Gratiot Avenue. Please consider attending the outside Feast Day of the Assumption on August 15, 2016 at the 7:00 pm Mass. There is a candle light procession after the Mass. There will be shuttle service from St. Veronica Parish in Eastpointe.

Why a Fourth Degree?

Thirteen Colonies that welcomed Catholics was Maryland. Thus, the first diocese in American was Baltimore, and many of our older Knights learned their faith in the 1950s and '60s using the Baltimore Catechism.

Things weren't any better for Catholics in the 1800s. Catholics immigrating to the United States often could only find menial, dangerous jobs, such as in coal mines and factories. They were jobs that often made the wives and children of these men widows, fatherless, and homeless due to an accident on the job. The Knights of Columbus was formed in 1882 to aid these women and children.

However, that did not stop anti-Catholicism. It was commonly felt at the time that Catholics could not be good Americans because they owed their allegiance and loyalty to the Pope. One of the main persecutors of the Knights of Columbus along this line was the Ku Klux Klan. In an effort to refute such claims, the Knights of Columbus formed the Fourth Degree, the Patriotic Degree, in 1900. Over 1200 Knights from across the country attended the first exemplification in New York City, thus earning the title "Sir Knight."

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus is to promote a love of country and impress the duties of citizenship upon its members. Its motto is Patriotism - a patriotism enlightened and informed by religion. The patriotic work of the Sir Knights continues on to this day. Fourth Degree Knights everywhere, often in their distinction regalia, work to support and assist veterans and active military personnel with such programs as assisting at Veterans Administration hospitals, conducting Flag protocol programs, sending packages to troops deployed overseas, protecting the phase "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance, and participating in parades and patriotic events. In addition, they continue to support the Church by participating in many Church activities and events in local parishes.

Please consider joining the Fourth Degree and supporting them in their efforts. To be eligible, a Knight must be over 18 years of age, a U. S. citizen, a practical Catholic in union with the Holy See, and a Third Degree member. Applications can be obtained from Fourth Degree Knights already in your Council. The next exemplification is Saturday, September 17 at DeCarlo's Banquet Center in Warren. We hope to see you there!

Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

How to Prove Live Begins at Conception Part 2

Making our case

How can the pro-life advocates prove the unborn are biological human beings? It may be tempting to use in utero images, or ultrasounds of children as our sole evidence of their humanity. While this tactic is useful in some cases, it has the potential to reinforce the idea that our human value comes from what we look like instead of what we are. It's not a good way to demonstrate the humanity of a four-week-old child who resembles a tadpole.

Pro-life advocates should also avoid making simplistic claims such as "Abortion kills a life" or even "Human life begins at conception." This leaves them open to a rebuttal such as this one atheist Carl Sagan:

Despite many claims to the contrary, life does not begin at conception: It is an unbroken chain that stretches back nearly to the origin of the Earth, 4.6 billion years ago. Nor does human life begin at conception: It is an unbroken chain dating back to the origin of our species, hundreds of thousands of years ago (*Billions @ Billions*, 201).

While it is true that living cells or human cells have a long history, the same is not true for individual human beings. Sagan's criticism is overcome if we drop the assertion "Life begins at conception" and say instead, "A human organism begins to exist at conception" or "The life of an individual human being begins at conception."

The difference may seem like purely semantical, but it is important to use this vocabulary with pro-choice advocates who may think an embryo is alive in the same sense that sperm and egg are alive. This mistaken set of assumptions may cause the pro-choice advocate to think that an embryo's life never really begins at conception. He might instead think that at conception life in the form of sperm and egg was rearranged and became life in the form of an embryo. This new "rearrangement" would then have the same value as an egg or sperm until it becomes a human being later in pregnancy.

When it comes to defending the claim that an individual human being begins to exist at conception, I don't recommend generic appeals to authority such as "Science says life begins at conception" or "All scientists agree life begins at conception." The members of your audience may simply not believe you, or they may think the authorities you are citing are wrong. Instead, I recommend using a simple argument that shows that at conception two body parts (sperm and egg) recombine and form a new living, whole, human organism who is growing and developing into adulthood.

My favorite argument for the humanity of the unborn is based on Steve Wagner's "10 second pro-life apologist." (*Common Ground Without Compromise*, 69). Steve was once flustered that he could not defend his pro-life beliefs in an impromptu conversation, so he crafted a 10-second bite that goes like this:

If it's growing, isn't it alive?
If it has human parents, isn't it human?
And human beings like you and me are valuable, aren't
we?

Sometimes Steve's sound bite will do the trick, and the person to whom you are talking will accept that the unborn are biological human beings. Other times you may have to use more evidence to prove that the unborn are (1) alive, (2) human, and (3) whole organisms.
