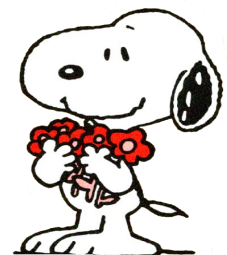
Valentine for assisting myself in the celebration of the Stations of the Cross.

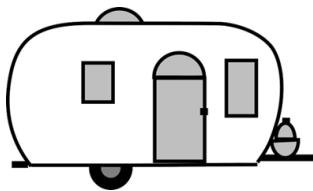

"No." he replied quietly.

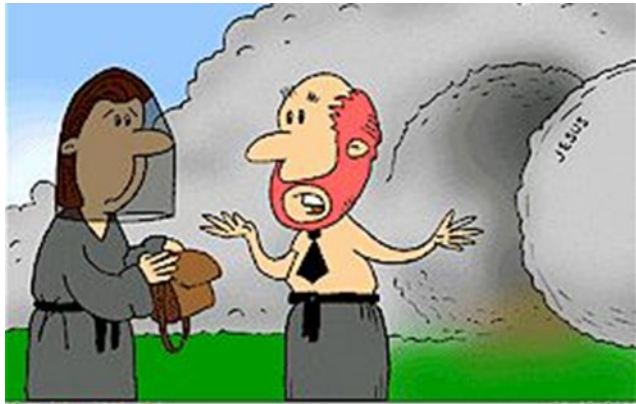

The Man of the Shroud Exhibit

at St. Paul of Tarsus Parish

The Shroud of Turin has long been venerated by the faithful and is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth. The Shroud is one of the most scientifically studied religious icons in history. The Center for the Study of the Passion of Christ and the Holy Shroud has developed a moving and informative exhibit on the Shroud of Turin, including a full-length photographic image of the Shroud. In addition, on display will be a large crucified corpus showing the wounds of Christ corresponding to the passion narrative in the Gospel accounts and the wounds shown on the Shroud. Also included in the exhibit are 92 panels detailing the history and science of the Shroud. *Free will donations will be accepted to help with upkeep of the exhibit.*

Many parish volunteers will be needed to help greet guests and direct them through the exhibit. A background check and participation at Protecting God's Children workshop is required for all volunteers. A volunteer sign-up sheet will be posted beginning April 29, by the ministry sign-up sheets on the bulletin board in the gathering space.

"The icon of this love is the shroud, that, even now, has attracted so many people here to Turin," Pope Francis said. "The shroud draws [people] to the tormented face and body of Jesus and, at the same time, directs [people] toward the face of every suffering and unjustly persecuted person."

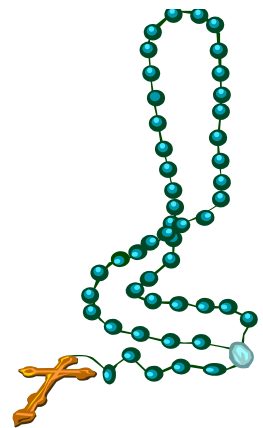
