Finally, a week later, the bartender broached the subject on behalf of the town. "I don't mean to pry, but folks around here are wondering why you always order three beers at a time?"



Are You an "APOLOGIST" You probably are...

Seven Rules of Engagement continued:

Stay focused. If you have ever engaged a non-Catholic in any serious conversation about your faith, you are probably familiar with what I call the "doctrinal dance." They will ask you a question about purgatory, and, right in the middle of your answer, they will say something like "Well, why do you worship Mary?" As you respond to that, they will say, "Why, do you believe the pope can't sin?" As you explain papal infallibility, they will say "Why do you confess your sins to a man instead of God?" Hence, the doctrinal dance. Some non-Catholics switch the subject whenever you have an answer to their questions. Don't let them do it. Keep bringing the conversation back, in a firm but gentle way, to one main topic until you have said all that you want to say on that topic. Then you may move on.

Know to whom you are talking. For our purposes, there are two main types of apologetics: Catholic apologetics for non-Catholics and Catholic apologetics for Catholics. The people I have had the most trouble convincing on any given truth of the Catholic faith are not Protestants but Catholics—people who attend Mass every Sunday and who pick which of the Church's teaching they want to believe, just like you would choose or reject items of food as you go down the line in a cafeteria. The term often used to describe such people is "cafeteria Catholics."

Donation Requests

This procedure will apply to all mail requests and requests made from the floor. Please remember this procedure if you have a request to be made.



All campers will need to reserve their own site. Go to: www.michigan.gov/dnr


