# Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your

policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as benefi-

ciary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named

on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

#### 4th of July

Independence Day (colloquially the Fourth of July) is a federal holiday in the United States commemorating the Declaration of Independence, which was ratified by the Second Continental Congress on July 4, 1776. The Second Continental Congress declared that the Thirteen Colonies were no longer subject (and subordinate) to the monarch of Britain, King George III, and were now united, free, and independent states. [1] The Congress had voted to declare independence two days earlier, on July 2, but it was not declared until July 4. [1]

Independence Day is commonly associated with <u>fireworks</u>, <u>parades</u>, <u>barbecues</u>, <u>carnivals</u>, <u>fairs</u>, <u>picnics</u>, <u>concerts</u>, <u>baseball games</u>, <u>family reunions</u>, <u>political speeches</u>, and ceremonies, in addition to various other public and private events celebrating the history, government, and traditions of the United States. Independence Day is the national day of the United States.

During the <u>American Revolution</u>, the legal separation of the <u>thirteen colonies</u> from Great Britain in 1776 actually occurred on July 2, when the <u>Second Continental Congress</u> voted to approve a <u>resolution of independence</u> that had of <u>Virginia</u> declaring the United States independent

been proposed in June by <u>Richard Henry</u>
<u>Lee</u> of <u>Virginia</u> declaring the United States independent from Great Britain's rule. After voting for independence, Congress turned its attention to the <u>Declaration of Independence</u>, a statement explaining this decision, which had been prepared by a <u>Committee of Five</u>, with <u>Thomas Jefferson</u> as its principal author. Congress debated and revised the wording of the <u>Declaration</u> to remove its vigorous denunciation of the <u>slave trade</u>, finally approving it two days later on July 4. A day earlier, <u>John Adams</u> had written to his wife <u>Abigail</u>:

The second day of July 1776, will be the most memorable epoch in the history of America. I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated by succeeding generations as the great anniversary festival. It ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forever more. Adams's prediction was off by two days. From the outset, Americans celebrated independence on July 4, the date shown on the much-publicized Declaration of Independence, rather than on July 2, the date the resolution of independence was approved in a closed session of Congress. Historians have long disputed whether members of Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, even though Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin all later wrote that they had signed it on that day. Most historians have concluded that the Declaration was signed nearly a month after its adoption, on August 2, 1776, and not on July 4 as is commonly believed.

By a remarkable coincidence, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, the only two signatories of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as <u>presidents of the United States</u>, both died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration, Jefferson even mentioning the fact. Although not a signatory of the Declaration of Independence, <u>James Monroe</u>, another <u>Founding Father</u> who was elected president, also died on July 4, 1831, making him the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. The only U.S. president to have been born on Independence Day was <u>Calvin Coolidge</u>, who was born on July 4, 1872.

All campers will need to reserve their own site. Go to: www.michigan.gov/dnr


We are suggesting, for the majority of our council campers, to try and select a site in the North end of the Riverfront North Loop. You can of course pick a site wherever you prefer.
